## JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

Monday, August 4, 2014.

Met at one minute past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Keenan in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Keenan), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Engrossed Bills — Laid Before the Governor.

The following engrossed bills (having been passed to be enacted and signed by the President on Friday, August 1, 2004) Further regulating regional school district planning committees (see House, No. 3789, amended) (which originated in the House); Providing for the preservation and improvement of land, parks and clean energy in the Commonwealth (see House, No. 4375) (which originated in the House);

Relative to the reduction of gun violence (see House, No. 4376) (which originated in the House); and Promoting economic growth across the Commonwealth (see House, No. 4377) (which originated in the House); Were severally laid before the Governor for his approbation on Monday, August 4, 2014.
