### JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

*Tuesday, October 14, 2014.*

Met according to adjournment at eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Rosenberg in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Senator from Essex and Middlesex, Mr. Tarr, then led the Chair (Mr. Rosenberg), members, guests and staff in the recitation of the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

#### Communication.

Communication from the Department of Environmental Protection (pursuant to Section 51 of Chapter 286 of the Acts of 2014) submitting final revisions to the Water Management Act Regulations 310 CMR 36.00, with supporting documentation (copies having been forwarded to the Senate Committee on Ways and Means and the Joint Committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture) (received October 9, 2014),-- **was read and sent to the House for its information.**

#### PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

A petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4507) of Harold P. Naughton, Jr., Harriette L. Chandler and Jennifer L. Flanagan (by vote of the town) that the board of selectmen of the town of Clinton be authorized to appoint the town collector for said town,-- **was referred, in concurrence, to the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government.**

A Bill relative to the Massachusetts life and health insurance guaranty association law (House, No. 4505,-- on House, No. 922),-- **was read and, under Senate Rule 26, referred to the committee on Ethics and Rules.**

#### *Recess.*

There being no objection, at seven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., the Chair (Mr. Rosenberg) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at twenty minutes past three o'clock P.M., the Senate reassembled, Mr. Rosenberg in the Chair.

#### *Resolutions.*

The following resolutions (having been filed with the Clerk) were considered forthwith and adopted, as follows:-

Resolutions (filed by Mr. Ross) "congratulating Lillian Ossipoff on her one hundredth birthday."

#### *Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.*

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

The Senate Bill authorizing an ordinance amending chapter 11, article II, division 2 entitled "City Treasurer" of the city code of the city of Peabody (Senate, No. 2314),-- **was read a second time.**

**Pending the question on ordering the bill to a third reading Ms. Lovely presented an amendment substituting a new draft**

entitled "An Act authorizing certain investments by the Treasurer of the city of Peabody (Senate, No. 2382).  
The amendment was adopted.  
The bill (Senate, No. 2382) was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed.  
Sent to the House for concurrence.

The Senate Bill relative to the position of Treasurer-Collector in the town of Carver (Senate, No. 2364),-- was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to read as follows: "An Act relative to the position of treasurer-collector in the town of Carver".  
Sent to the House for concurrence.

*Reports of Committees.*

By Mr. Rosenberg, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the Senate petition of of Harriette L. Chandler and Mary S. Keefe for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Alexis Baez, an employee of the Worcester Recovery Center and Hospital.  
**Senate Rule 36 was suspended, on motion of Mr. Brewer, and the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Public Service.**

By Mr. Rosenberg, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the Senate petition of Richard T. Moore and John V. Fernandes for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Dean Bassett, an employee of the Executive Office of Labor and Workforce Development.  
**Senate Rule 36 was suspended, on motion of Mr. Brewer, and the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Public Service.**

By Mr. Rosenberg, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the Senate petition of Stanley C. Rosenberg and Peter V. Kocot for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Jessica R. Brand, an employee of the Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance.  
**Senate Rule 36 was suspended, on motion of Mr. Brewer, and the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Public Service.**  
Severally sent to the House for concurrence.

**PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE**

*Engrossed Bills.*

The following engrossed bills (the first of which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the Acting President (Mr. Rosenberg) and laid before the Governor for his approbation, to wit:

Authorizing the town of Ipswich to grant 2 additional licenses for the sale (see Senate, No. 2279, amended); and Relative to private roads in the town of Barnstable (see House, No. 4409).

*Recess.*

There being no objection, at twenty-six minutes before four o'clock P.M., the Chair (Mr. Rosenberg) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at eleven minutes before four o'clock P.M., the Senate reassembled, Mr. Rosenberg in the Chair.

**PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.**

A Bill making appropriations for the fiscal year 2014 to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and for certain other activities and projects (House, No. 4508,-- on House, No. 4301, in part),-- **was read.**

**There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Brewer, and the bill was read a second time. Pending the question on ordering the bill to a third reading, the same Senator moved that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate documents numbered 2383.**

**The amendment was adopted.**

**The bill, as amended, was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.**

**Sent to the House for concurrence in the amendment.**

*Order Adopted.*

On motion of Mr. Humason,--

*Ordered*, That when the Senate adjourns today, it adjourn to meet again on Thursday next at eleven o'clock A.M., and that the Clerk be directed to dispense with the printing of a calendar.

On motion of Mr. Tarr, at eight minutes before four o'clock P.M., the Senate adjourned to meet again on Thursday next at eleven o'clock A.M.\
