Monday, October 20, 2014.

Met at ten minutes past at eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. DiDomenico in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. DiDomenico), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Communications.

The following communications were severally received an placed on file to wit:

Communication from Martin J. Benison, Comptroller (under the provisions of Section 6B of Chapter 29 of the General Laws) submitting a quarterly report on the status of federal funds applied for, received and expended (received October 8, 2014); Communication from the Norfolk County Sheriff submitting a plan of action relative to inspection of the Norfolk County Sheriff Correction Center and Dedham Alternative Center (received October 17, 2014); and

Communication from Steven Grossman, Treasurer and Receiver General, (pursuant to Section 14 of Chapter 259 of the Acts of 2014) submitting notice of his designee to the Water Infrastructure Advisory Committee (received October 17, 2014).

Reports of a Committee.

By Ms. Forry, for the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government, on petition, a Bill relative to the Glenwood Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund (Senate, No. 2374) [Local approval received]; and

By the same Senator, for the same committee, on petition, a Bill to authorize the board of selectmen of the town of Clinton to appoint the Town Treasurer (Senate, No. 2377) [Local approval received];

Severally read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

A Bill establishing a Mystic River watershed water quality commission (House, No. 4302,-- on House, No. 785),-- was read and, under Senate Rule 27, referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Resolutions.

The following resolutions (having been filed with the Clerk) were severally considered forthwith and adopted, as follows:-

Resolutions (filed by Mr. Downing) "commending Mary K. Grant, Ph.D., for her dedicated service and leadership to the Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts";

Resolutions (filed by Mr. Lewis) "congratulating Stephen Brennan Rock on the fortieth anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood"; and

Resolutions (filed by Ms. Murray) "highlighting the Commonwealth as a global hub for health technology innovation on the occasion of the Second Massachusetts Connected Health Week being held from October 20 to 24, 2014.

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

The House Bill relative to the board of public works in the town of Fairhaven (House, No. 4128),-- was read a second time. Mr. Montigny presented an amendment that the bill be amended in section 2 by inserting after the second paragraph the following paragraph:-

"Notwithstanding any provision of this act to the contrary, those duties previously vested in the board of public works for the setting of rates and fees, for the negotiation of collective bargaining agreements and for the issuance of licenses, permits, variances and similar forms of regulatory approval, shall be vested in the board of selectmen for the town of Fairhaven."

The amendment was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.

Sent to the House for concurrence in the amendment.

The House Bill relative to the funding of maintenance and improvements of private ways in the town of Barnstable (House, No. 4410),-- was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

A petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4509) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., relative electronic automobile insurance charges,-referred in concurrence, under suspension of Joint Rule 12, to the committee on Financial Services.

Recess.

There being no objection, at thirteen minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., the Chair (Mr. DiDomenico) declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair; and, at seventeen minutes past three o'clock P.M., the Senate reassembled, Mr. Brewer in the Chair.

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

The Senate Bill relative to cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification for athletic coaches (Senate, No. 1918),-- came from the House passed to be engrossed, in concurrence with an amendment striking out section 2 and inserting in place thereof the following section:

"SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on August 1, 2015.".

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr and the House amendment was considered forthwith and adopted, in concurrence.
