On motion of Ms. Lovely,--

Ordered, That a joint committee to consist of members of Senate and the House of Representatives be appointed for the purpose of canvassing the votes for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Treasurer and Receiver General, and Auditor of the Commonwealth and Executive Councillors.

Canvassing the votes.

Senators Michael J. Rodrigues of Bristol and Plymouth, Collins of Suffolk, Crighton of Essex, deMacedo of Plymouth and Barnstable and Tran of Worcester and Middlesex, were appointed the committee on the part of the Senate.

Sent to the House for concurrence.

Subsequently, the order was returned by the House with the endorsement that it had been adopted, in concurrence.

The order bore the further endorsement that Representatives Reps. Hawkins of Attleboro, Cabral of New Bedford and Hill of Ipswich were appointed on the part of the House.
