Charles F. Federico, of South Boston, passed away Sunday, January 20, 2019. Beloved husband of Carolyn B. (Davy). Devoted father of Bernadette Kozak & her husband Peter, Charles M. Federico and his fiancee Patricia McNeil, Darlene Ferrara & her husband Paul, Christopher Federico & his wife Julina. Brother of Louise, Arlene, Nancy, Veronica, Frances, Mary, David, Patty, and Charmain. Also survived by seven grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.

Charlie was the owner of Federico's Bike Shop on Emerson Street in South Boston for 40 years, after his father opened it in 1938. A fixture of the community, Charlies shop was always open to help local youth learn how to fix their bikes, often free. His charitable nature and his gift of knowledge left a lasting impact on the community of South Boston.
