Tuesday, May 28, 2019.

Met at three minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Boncore in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Boncore), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

There being no objection, the Chair (Mr. Boncore) handed the gavel to Mr. Timilty for the purpose of an introduction. Mr. Timilty then introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, the 8th grade class from Saint Francis of Assisi School in Braintree. The students were on a field trip to the State House learning about the different aspects of state government. They were accompanied by Principal Brian Cote and teacher Drew MacKenzie. The Senate welcomed them with applause and they withdrew from the Chamber. They were also guests of Senator Keenan and Representative Cusak of Braintree.
