## JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Wednesday, June 12, 2019.

Met at three minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Hinds in the Chair).

#### Recess.

There being no objection, at four minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., the Chair (Mr. Hinds) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair, and, at four minutes before twelve o'clock noon, the Senate reassembled, Ms. Creem in the Chair.

#### Reports of Committees.

By Mr. Rodrigues, for the committee on Ways and Means, on House, No. 3819, reported, in part, a "Bill making appropriations for the fiscal year 2019 to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and for certain other activities and projects" (Senate, No. 2255) [Direct appropriation \$3,500,000].

Supplemental appropriations.

The bill was read. There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the bill was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed.

Sent to the House for concurrence

By Mr. Rodrigues, for the committee on Ways and Means, that the Senate Bill authorizing the commissioner of capital asset management and maintenance to convey certain property in the town of Templeton (Senate, No. 1854),-- ought to pass, with an amendment substituting a new draft with the same title (Senate, No. 2256).

Templeton,-- land.

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the bill was read a second time and was amended, as recommended by the committee on Ways and Means.

The bill (Senate, No. 2256) was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading as follows: "An Act authorizing the commissioner of capital asset management and maintenance to convey or lease certain real property in the town of Templeton".

Sent to the House for concurrence.
