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JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Tuesday, March 17, 2020.

Met at eleven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Rodrigues in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE

Engrossed Bills.

The following engrossed bills (the first of which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the Acting President (Mr. Rodrigues) and laid before the Governor for his approbation, to wit:

Authorizing the city of Easthampton to grant 8 additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises, 4 additional licenses for the sale of wine and malt beverages to be drunk on the premise and 1 additional license for the sale of wine and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises (see Senate, No. 2381, amended); and

Establishing the appointed office of town clerk in the town of Pelham (see House, No. 4101).

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

The Senate Bill authorizing the town of Sutton to grant real property abatements to certain military personnel (Senate, No. 1650),-- was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed.

The House Bill relative to the town treasurer, town tax collector and town clerk of the town of Chester (House, No. 4283),-- was read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.
