### JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Friday, November 6, 2020.

Met at twenty-eight minutes before one o'clock P.M. (Mr. Collins in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Collins), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Reports.

The following reports were severally received and placed on file, to wit:

Report of the Supplier Diversity Office of the Operational Services Division (pursuant to Section 61(s) of Chapter 7 of the General Laws) submitting its Comprehensive Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2020 (received November 5, 2020); and

Report of the Child Support Enforcement Division of the Department of Revenue (pursuant to Section 31 of Chapter 34 of the Acts of 2019) submitting its report on implementation of medical legislation providing health care coverage for children (received August 4, 2020).

#### Report of a Committee.

By Mr. Finegold, for the committee on Public Service, on petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2942), a Bill establishing a sick leave bank for George Monfreda, an employee of the Worcester Recovery Center and Hospital (Senate, No. 2943).

The bill was read. There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. O'Connor, and the bill was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. O'Connor, and the bill was read a second time.

Pending the question on ordering the bill to a third reading, Mr. Rodrigues moved that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2944.

#### The amendment was adopted.

After remarks, the bill, as amended, was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and after remarks, passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.
