Thursday, August 20, 2020.

Met at seven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Eldridge in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Eldridge), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

The following reports were severally received and placed on file to wit:

Report of the Massachusetts Commission on the Status of Women (pursuant to Section 66(3) of Chapter 3 of the General Laws) submitting its Fiscal Year 2020 Annual Report (received August 11, 2020); and

Report of the Department of Correction (pursuant to Section 119A(i) of Chapter 127 of the General Laws) submitting its annual report on medical parole (received August 17, 2020).

Report of Committee.

By Ms. Rausch, for the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government, on petition, a Bill authorizing the investment of town of Lunenburg library trust funds (Senate, No. 2898) [Local approval received];

Read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

Committees Discharged.

Ms. Lovely, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, reported, asking to be discharged from further consideration:

Of the Senate Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Education to make an investigation and study of a certain current Senate document relative to a moratorium of the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (Senate, No. 2899); and

Of the Senate Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Elder Affairs to make an investigation and study of certain current Senate documents relative to elder issues (Senate, No. 2900);

And recommending that the same severally be referred to the committee on Rules. Under Senate Rule 36, the reports were severally considered forthwith and accepted.

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

Order.

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tran, and, after remarks, the order (House, No. 4951) was considered forthwith; and adopted, in concurrence.

Engrossed Bills.

The following engrossed bills (the first of which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the Acting President (Mr. Eldridge) and laid before the Governor for his approbation, to wit:
