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## JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Monday, February 28, 2022.

Met at twenty-two minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Brownsberger in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

## Matter Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matter was taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

## Engrossed Bill.

An engrossed Bill changing the term of office of the mayor in the city known as the town of Agawam to 4 years (see Senate, No. 2523, amended) (which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and signed by the Acting President (Mr. Brownsberger) and laid before the Governor for his approbation.

## Reports of a Committee.

By Mr. Rodrigues, for the committee on Ways and Means, that the House Bill authorizing the Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance to convey a certain parcel of land to the town of Hudson (House, No. 4126),-- ought to pass, with an amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2729.

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. O'Connor, and the bill was read a second time and was amended, as recommended by the committee on Ways and Means.

After the bill as amended is ordered to a third reading, it shall immediately be read a third time and the question shall then immediately be on passing it to be engrossed, and no

amendments shall be in order at the third reading of the bill unless recommended by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. O'Connor, and the order was considered forthwith and adopted.

The bill will be placed in the Orders of the Day for Thursday, March 3, 2022, for a second reading with the amendment pending.
