Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

The House Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Julie A. Hall, an employee of the trial court of the commonwealth (House, No. 5098) (its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading),-- was read a third time.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, Mr. Cyr presented an amendment inserting after the word "court", in line 3, the first time it appears, the following words:- ", to care for her family member".

The amendment was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.
