JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Monday, September 12, 2022.

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

A petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5280) of Kay Khan and Cynthia Stone Creem (with the approval of the mayor and city council) that the city of Newton be authorized to lease the West Newton Armory for a term of years not exceeding ninety-nine years,-- was referred, in concurrence, to the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government.

Relative to private street betterment assessments in the city of Worcester (House, No. 4327,-- on petition) [Local approval received]; and

Exempting the police chief of the town of Wrentham from the civil service law (House, No. 4452) [Local approval received];

Were severally read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

Emergency Preamble Adopted.

An engrossed Bill authorizing the division of capital asset management and maintenance to convey a certain parcel of land to the town of Danvers (see House, No. 5162), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.

Danvers,-- land conveyance.

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Mr. Brownsberger) and sent to the House for enactment.

Authorizing the town of Southbridge to grant additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises (see Senate, No. 2818);

Designating a certain bridge in the town of Bedford as the Major Barry Allan Seidman, USAF Memorial Bridge (see House, No. 4446);

Changing the board of selectmen of the town of Shrewsbury to the select board (see House, No. 5011);

To reduce traffic fatalities (see House, No. 5103, amended); and

Authorizing the division of capital asset management and maintenance to convey a certain parcel of land to the town of Danvers (see House, No. 5162).
