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## JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Monday, October 31, 2022.

Met at nine minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Pacheco in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Pacheco), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

### Distinguished Guests.

There being no objection, the Chair (Mr. Pacheco) introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, Francisco Duarte Lopes, the Ambassador of Portugal to the United States. Ambassador Lopes assumed his position on June 7, 2022. He was visiting the State House in recognition of the 200th anniversary of the Portuguese Consulate General in Boston that took place on October 31, 1822. The Senate welcomed him with applause, he addressed the Senate from the Rostrum, signed the guestbook and withdrew from the Chamber. He was accompanied by Tiago Araujo, Consul General of Portugal in Boston, João Caixinha, Coordinator for the Teaching of Portuguese in the U.S. and Paulo Martins, Counselor for the Portuguese Communities in New England. He was also guests of Senators Rodrigues and Lovely and Representatives Cabral of New Bedford, Hendricks of New Bedford, Oliveira of Ludlow, Uyterhoeven of Somerville and Vitolo of Brookline and Thomas Pelky from Representative Digg's Office.

Establishing a task force on sexual assault counsellors (House, No. 5363,-- on Senate, No. 1448 and House, No. 2317); and

Were severally read and, under Joint Rule 29, referred to the committee on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.

A Bill recognizing Sikh Appreciation Month (House, No. 4569,-- on House, No. 3139),-- was read and, under Senate Rule 26, referred to the committee on Rules.

## Reports of Committees.

By Ms. Lovely, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the Senate petition of Walter F. Timilty, Michael D. Brady, Gerard J. Cassidy and Alyson M. Sullivan for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Lisa Balentine, an employee of the Department of Transitional Assistance;

Senate Rule 36 was suspended, on motion of Mr. Fattman, and the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Public Service.

Sent to the House for concurrence.

Ms. Lovely, for the committee on Rules, reported that the following matter be placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session:

The House bill designating United States highway route 20 in Massachusetts the Medal of Honor Highway (House, No. 4436) (also based on Senate, No. 3061) (the committee on Rules recommending that the bill be amended by inserting after the word "department", in line 5, the following words:- "and at locations that do not conflict with existing designations").

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Fattman, and the bill was read a second time and was amended, as recommended by the committee on Rules.

The bill, as amended, was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to read as follows:- "An Act designating the portion of United States highway route 20 in Massachusetts the Medal of Honor Highway".
