Thursday, October 6, 2022.

Met at ten minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Ms. Friedman in the Chair).

The Chair (Ms. Friedman), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

There being no objection, the Chair (Ms. Friedman) introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, Father Gary Donegan and Reverend Bill Shaw, clergy members from Northern Ireland. They were recognized widely for their peace and reconciliation work leading up to and now in the wake of the historic Belfast Agreement, also known as the Good Friday Agreement, which marked the official end of the Troubles in Northern Ireland. They were meeting in Boston and Washington to discuss the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of that agreement, which takes place next year. They were accompanied by Fiona Calnan, also of Ireland, and were guests of the Auditor of the Commonwealth, Suzanne M. Bump. The group was welcomed with applause, they signed the guest book and withdrew from the Chamber.
