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JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Tuesday, October 11, 2022.

Met at eleven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Collins in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Collins), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

The House Bill authorizing the city of Salem to grant an additional license for the sale of wine and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises (House, No. 4665) (its title having been changed by the committee on Bill in the Third Reading),-- was read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

The House Bill authorizing the town of Mendon to establish a means-tested senior citizen property tax exemption (House, No. 3901),-- was read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

The House Bill changing the number of members of the insurance advisory committee for the town of Milford (House, No. 4275) (its title having been changed by the committee on Bill in the Third Reading),-- was read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

The House Bill authorizing the town of Milford to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be consumed on the premises (House, No. 4668, amended),-- was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading as follows:- "An Act authorizing the town of Milford to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises".
