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Met at seven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Collins in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Collins), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of Pledge of allegiance. allegiance to the flag.

## Communications.

The following communications were severally received and placed on file, to wit:

Report of a Committee.
By Mr. Rodrigues, for the committee on Ways and Means, that the House Bill making appropriations for the Fiscal Year 2023 to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and for certain other activities and projects (House, No. 58),-- ought to pass, with an amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 23 [Total Appropriation: \$366,736,615.00] [\$814.3 million in General Obligation Bonds].

## Order Adopted.

Mr. Rodrigues presented the following order, to wit:
Ordered, That notwithstanding Senate Rule 7 or any other rule to the contrary, the House Bill making appropriations for the Fiscal Year 2023 to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and for certain other activities and projects (House, No. 58) (the committee on Ways and Means having recommended that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 23) shall be placed in the Orders of the Day for a second reading on Thursday, March 9, 2023.

All amendments shall be filed electronically in the office of the Clerk of the Senate by 5:00 P.M., on Tuesday, March 7, 2023. All such amendments shall be second reading amendments to the Senate Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 23), but further amendments in the third degree to such amendments shall be in order. The Clerk shall further specify the procedure and format for filing all amendments, consistent with this order.

After the bill, as amended, is ordered to a third reading, it shall immediately be read a third time and the question shall then immediately be on passing it to be engrossed, and no amendments shall be in order at the third reading of the bill unless recommended by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Rodrigues, and the order was considered forthwith and adopted.

The bill will be placed in the Orders of the Day for Thursday, March 9, 2023, for a second reading with the amendment pending.
