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Monday, May 1, 2023.

Met at five minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. DiDomenico in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. DiDomenico), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Distinguished Guests.

There being no objection, the Chair (Mr. DiDomenico) handed the gavel to Mr. Timilty for the purpose of an introduction. Mr. Timilty then introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, staff and family from "Be Inspired Together". The mission of this group is to provide financial support for those with the greatest need to be able to access the appropriate level of mental health services, regardless of financial means. All fundraising efforts work towards providing scholarships to bridge these gaps. "Be Inspired Together" was created by "Be Inspired Counseling" owner, Marci daCamara. Also, among the group were: Chris Basse, Pam Basse, Christina Mitchell, Chris daCamara, Bella daCamara, and Grace daCamara. The Senate welcomed them with applause, and they withdrew from the Chamber.
