An engrossed Bill providing for the terms of certain bonds to provide for a program of housing, community development, economic opportunities, support for local governments, increased innovation and job creation to be issued by the Commonwealth (see House, No. 3862), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Mr. Collins) and sent to the House for enactment.

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

The House Bill authorizing the town of Wakefield to establish a means tested senior citizen property tax exemption (House, No. 3807),-- was read a third time.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, Mr. Lewis presented an amendment adding the following section:-

"SECTION 7. This act shall take effect upon its passage."

The amendment was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.
