Thursday, June 8, 2023.

Met at eleven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Timilty in the Chair).

# Reports of a Committee.

By Mr. Rodrigues, for the committee on Ways and Means, that the House Bill relative to providing for the terms of certain bonds to provide for a program of housing, community development, economic opportunities, support for local governments, increased innovation and job creation to be issued by the Commonwealth (House, No. 3862),-- ought to pass.

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Fattman, and the bill was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

By Mr. Rodrigues, for the committee on Ways and Means, that the House Bill relative Tax relief and policy. to improve the Commonwealth's competitiveness, affordability, and equity (House, No. 3770),-- ought to pass, with an amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2397.

#### Order Adopted.

Mr. Rodrigues offered the following order, to wit:

*Ordered*, That notwithstanding Senate Rule 7 or any other rule to the contrary, the House Bill to improve the Commonwealth's competitiveness, affordability, and equity (House, No. 3770) (the committee on Ways and Means having recommended that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2397) shall be placed in the Orders of the Day for a second reading on Thursday, June 15, 2023.

All amendments shall be filed electronically in the office of the Clerk of the Senate by 5:00 P.M, on Monday, June 12, 2023. All such amendments shall be second reading amendments to the Senate Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 2397), but further amendments in the third degree to such amendments shall be in order. The Clerk shall further specify the procedure and format for filing all amendments, consistent with this order.

After the bill as amended is ordered to a third reading, it shall immediately be read a third time and the question shall then immediately be on passing it to be engrossed, and no amendments shall be in order at the third reading of the bill unless recommended by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Fattman, and the order was considered forthwith and adopted.

# PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

The House Bill financing improvements to municipal roads and bridges (House, No. 3547),-- came from the House with the endorsement that the House had NON-concurred in the Senate amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in Senate document numbered 2375, and had asked for a committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two branches; and that Representatives Straus of Mattapoisett, Murray of Milford and Howitt of Seekonk had been appointed the committee on the part of the House.

On motion of Mr. Fattman, the Senate insisted on its amendment and concurred in the appointment of a committee of conference; and Senators Crighton, Mark and O'Connor were appointed on the part of the Senate.

The bill was returned to the House endorsed accordingly.
