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JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Monday, June 3, 2024.

Met at eighteen minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Ms. Edwards in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The 4th and 5th grade classes from the Chace Street School in Somerset, led the Chair (Ms. Edwards), members, guests and staff in the recitation of the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

There being no objection, the Chair (Ms. Edwards) handed the gavel to Mr. Timilty for the purpose of an introduction. Mr. Timilty then introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, the 5th grade class from Tucker Elementary School in Milton. The graduating 5th grade class was on a field trip to the State House learning about the different aspects of state government. The students were accompanied by Principal Dr. William B. Carter, Jr., and teachers: Amy Poula, Justine Novak, Adrienne, Campbell, Christine England and Alex Boziel Pava. The Senate welcomed them with applause and they withdrew from the Chamber.

Were severally read and, under Senate Rule 27, referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Directing the city of Boston Police Department to waive the maximum age requirement for police officers for Nuias Daveiga (House, No. 4431,-- on petition) [Local approval received];

Were severally read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

The House Bill making appropriations for the fiscal year 2025 for the maintenance of the departments, boards, commissions, institutions, and certain activities of the commonwealth, for interest, sinking fund, and serial bond requirements, and for certain permanent improvements (House, No. 4601),-- came from the House with the endorsement that the House had NON-concurred in the Senate amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in Senate document numbered 2800, and had asked for a committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two branches; and that Representatives Michlewitz of Boston, Ferrante of Gloucester and Smola of Warren had been appointed the committee on the part of the House.

On motion of Mr. Tarr, the Senate insisted on its amendment and concurred in the appointment of a committee of conference; and Senators Rodrigues, Friedman and O'Connor were appointed on the part of the Senate.

The bill was returned to the House endorsed accordingly.

Senate Rule 36 was suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

By Ms. Lovely, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the Senate petition of Paegan Deering for legislation to direct the state retirement board to grant credible service to Paegan Deering.

Senate Rule 36 was suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Public Service.

Mr. Rodrigues presented the following order, to wit:

Ordered, That notwithstanding Senate Rule 7 or any other rule to the contrary, the House Bill to provide for the future information technology needs of Massachusetts (House, No. 4648) (the committee on Ways and Means having recommended that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2806) shall be placed in the Orders of the Day for a second reading on Thursday, June 6, 2024.

All amendments shall be filed electronically in the office of the Clerk of the Senate by 5:00 P.M, on Tuesday, June 4, 2024. All such amendments shall be second reading-amendments to the Senate Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 2806), but further amendments in the third degree to such amendments shall be in order. The Clerk shall further specify the procedure and format for filing all amendments, consistent with this order.

After the bill as amended is ordered to a third reading, it shall immediately be read a third time and the question shall then immediately be on passing it to be engrossed, and no amendments shall be in order at the third reading of the bill unless recommended by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the order was considered forthwith and adopted.

The bill will be considered on Thursday, June 6, 2024, for a second reading with the amendment pending.
