Ordered, That, notwithstanding the provisions of Joint Rule 10, the committee on Public Service be granted until Wednesday, July 31, 2024 within which time to make its final report on current House document numbered 4510.

Pending the question on adoption of the order, Mr. Brady presented an amendment in line 2 by striking out the words "Wednesday, July 31, 2024" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- "Tuesday, August 27, 2024".

The amendment was adopted.

The order (House, No. 4811), as amended, was then adopted. Sent to the House for concurrence in the amendment.

Ordered, That notwithstanding the provisions of Joint Rule 10, the committee on Public Service be granted until Saturday, August 31, 2024 within which time to make its final report on current House documents numbered 4724 and 4729.

Matter Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Oliveira, and the bill was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.

A Bill to amend chapter 336 of the acts of 2004 relative to the sale of alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises of clubs or veterans' organizations in the town of Natick (House, No. 4865,-- on House, No. 3996) [Local approval received on House, No. 3996],-- was read.

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Durant, and the bill was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.

Engrossed Bill.

An engrossed Bill establishing recall methods for elected officials in the town of Lakeville (see House, No. 4125) (which originated in the House), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and signed by the Acting President (Mr. Collins) and laid before the Governor for her approbation.
