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JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Wednesday, October 23, 2024.

Met at nine minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Brownsberger in the Chair) (having been appointed, by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Brownsberger), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

There being no objection, the Chair (Mr. Brownsberger) handed the gavel to Mr. O'Connor for the purpose of an introduction. Mr. O'Connor then introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, Bill Norton of Weymouth. Bill was visiting the State House in recognition of the kickoff event for the "Kevin for Kids" toy drive, organized in honor of his late partner Kevin McLean. In the past 15 years he has collected over 30,000 toys for less fortunate children during the holiday season. He was accompanied by Bridgewater Town Council member Paul Murphy, Nick Andrasy, USMC, John Bourne, US Army, Staff Sergeant Andrew Doll, Sergeant Mike Wedel, Sergeant Armando Treadwell, PFC Matthew Mchargue, Sergeant Jomel Dellomes, LCPL Scott Graham, CPL Alicia Wehrenberg and CPL Quinn Sharrow. The Senate welcomed them with applause and they withdrew from the Chamber.

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE

Engrossed Bill.

An engrossed Bill exempting the position of police chief in the city known as the town of Barnstable from the civil service law (see Senate, No. 2746) (which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and signed by the Acting President (Mr. Brownsberger) and laid before the Governor for her approbation.

There being no objection, at nineteen minutes before twelve o'clock noon, the Chair (Mr. Brownsberger) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and at eight minutes past three o'clock P.M., the Senate reassembled, Mr. Brownsberger in the Chair.

Committee of Conference Report.

Mr. Barrett for the committee of conference, on the disagreeing votes of the two branches, with reference to the House amendments to the Senate Bill upgrading the grid and protecting ratepayers (Senate, No. 2838) (*amended by the House* by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of House document numbered 4884 and by striking out the title and inserting in place thereof the following title: "An Act accelerating a responsible, innovative and equitable clean energy transition"),-- reports, a "Bill promoting a clean energy grid, advancing equity and protecting ratepayers." (Senate, No. 2967),-- was read.

Senate Rule 26 was suspended, on motion of Mr. Barrett.

After remarks, on motion of Mr. Tarr, the further consideration thereof was postponed until Thursday, October 24th.
