# Reports of Committees.

By Ms. Rausch, for the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government, on Senate, Nos. 1423, 1437, 1438, 1439, 1440, 1442, 1452, 1462, 1465, 1466, 1467, and 1470, an Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Municipalities and Regional Government, to make an investigation and study of certain current Senate documents relative to municipalities and regional government matters (Senate, No. 2669);

Referred, under Joint Rule 29, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.

By Mr. Cyr, for the committee on Housing, on petition, a Bill establishing an accessory dwelling unit trust fund (Senate, No. 969, changed in line 5-6, by striking out the definition of "eligible participant" and replacing it with the following definition:- "Eligible Participant," property owner who: (a) has an income of up to 110% of the area median income, as defined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; or (b) is a year-round resident of a municipality designated as a seasonal community pursuant to Section 32 of Chapter 23B, as appearing in section 5 of Chapter 150 of the Acts of 2024, who has an income up to the limit set forth in the definition of attainable housing under 760 CMR 76.00.; and by striking the words, in lines 8-10, the words "low- and moderate-income property owners whose incomes are not more than 110 per cent of median income as determined by the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- "eligible participants to");

Fund.-- Accessory dwelling unit.

Read and, under Senate Rule 27, referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

By Mr. Keenan, for the committee on Election Laws, on petition, a Bill authorizing the town of Berkley to recall elected officials (Senate, No. 2552) [Local approval received];

By Ms. Rausch, for the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government, on petition, a Bill relative to parking fines in the town of Scituate (Senate, No. 2577) [Local approval received];

By the same Senator, for the same committee, on petition, a Bill concerning sidewalks in the town of Scituate (Senate, No. 2578) [Local approval received]; and

# Emergency Preamble Adopted.

An engrossed Bill authorizing the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority to provide sewer services to a certain parcel of land in the town of Sharon (see House, No. 4009, amended), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.

Sharon,-- MWRA sewer services.

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Mr. DiDomenico) and sent to the House for enactment.

Matter Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following, matter was taken out of the Order of the Day and considered as follows:
