The bill was read. There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Durant, and the bill was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

The Senate Bill authorizing the town of Walpole to grant up to 2 additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises (Senate, No. 2532),-- **was read a third time and passed to be engrossed.**

The Senate Bill authorizing the city of Newton to issue pension obligation bonds or notes (Senate, No. 3092),-- was read a second time.

The amendment was adopted.

The bill (Senate, No. 3249) was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed.
