PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

A Bill amending the town meeting act for the town of Danvers (House, No. 5571,-- on petition) (Local approval received),--**was read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.**

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

The House Bill authorizing the town of Petersham to continue the employment of police department members Richard D. Cooley Jr. and David A. Shoemaker (House, No. 5110),-- was read a third time.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, Ms. Comerford presented an amendment in section 1, by inserting after the second sentence the following sentence:- “While continuing to serve as a police officers in the town of Petersham pursuant to this act, Richard D. Cooley Jr. and David A. Shoemaker shall comply with all requirements of chapter 6E of the General Laws, including: (i) maintaining certification and good standing with the Massachusetts Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission; and (ii) complying with all in-service and other training requirements mandated by the municipal police training committee.”

The amendment was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

The House Bill authorizing the city of Westfield to establish an age limit for original appointment to the position of firefighter (House, No. 5288) (its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading),-- **was read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.**

Engrossed Bills.

The following engrossed bills (all of which originated in the House), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the Acting President (Ms. Edwards) and laid before the Governor for her approbation, to wit:

Providing for a real property exemption for persons with disabilities in the town of Swampscott (see House, No. 4444);

Bills laid before the Governor.

Authorizing Sean Duffy to take the civil service examination for the position of firefighter in the city of Haverhill notwithstanding the maximum age requirement (see House, No. 4573);

Authorizing the division of capital asset management and maintenance to release a certain sewer line easement in the West Roxbury section of the city of Boston (see House, No. 5304);

Authorizing the town of Lynnfield to appropriate funds from the Golf Enterprise Fund to the Recreation Capital Trust Stabilization Fund (see House, No. 5416); and

Authorizing the division of capital asset management and maintenance to convey certain parcels of land to the town of Bolton, the town of Lancaster or a municipal utility serving the town of Bolton or the town of Lancaster (see House, No. 5440).
