PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

Petitions were severally referred, in concurrence, as follows, to wit:

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5659) of Kimberly N. Ferguson (by vote of the town) that the town of Rutland be authorized to grant one additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk off the premises;

Extending the timeframe for the issuance of licenses granted pursuant to chapter 46 of the acts of 2020 in the city of Easthampton (House, No. 5547,-- on petition) [Local approval received]; and

Amending the charter of the town of Bellingham to allow the Director of Finance to serve as the Town Accountant (House, No. 5564,-- on petition) [Local approval received];

Bellingham,-- town accountant.

Were severally read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

The Senate Bill providing equal opportunity for residents to vote on establishment of the Great River Regional School District (Senate, No. 3181),-- came from the House passed to be engrossed, in concurrence *with an amendment*, striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in House document numbered 5658.

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the House amendment was considered forthwith and adopted, in concurrence (as corrected BTR).

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE

Engrossed Bill.

An engrossed Bill authorizing the city of Westfield to establish an age limit for original appointment to the position of firefighter (see House, No. 5288, amended) (which originated in the House), **having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and signed by the Acting President (Mr. Keenan) and laid before the Governor for her approbation.**

Bill laid before the Governor.

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

The Senate Bill establishing a sewer and water advisory board in the town of Walpole (Senate, No. 3087) (its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading),-- **was read a third time and passed to be engrossed.**

Sent to the House for concurrence.

The House Bill amending the town of Arlington's means tested senior citizen property tax exemption (House, No. 4575),-- was read a third time.

Arlington,-- senior property tax exemption.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, Ms. Friedman presented an amendment in section 1, by inserting after the word "levy", in line 6, the following language:- "; provided, however, that the town shall have declared an overlay surplus pursuant to section 25 of chapter 59 of the General Laws prior to implementing clause (ii)."

The amendment was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.

The House Bill authorizing the City of Westfield to convert a seasonal license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk off premises to an annual license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk off premises (House, No. 5346),-- **was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.**

The House Bill modernizing financial departments in the city of Holyoke (House, No. 5448),-- **was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.**

The House Bill relative to amending the traffic commission in the city of Westfield (House, No. 5449),-- **was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.**

The House Bill authorizing the town of Wakefield to establish a means tested senior citizen property tax exemption (House, No. 5418),-- **was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.**

Adjournment in Memory of John F. "Jack" Wilk.

The Senator from Norfolk and Plymouth, Mr. Keenan, moved that when the Senate adjourns today, it does so in memory of John F. "Jack" Wilk of Quincy.

John F. "Jack" Wilk passed away peacefully on May 17, 2026, at the age of 86.

Jack grew up in Malden, Massachusetts and attended Malden Public Schools before enlisting in the US Army in 1959. Although he never saw active duty, he was very proud of his commitment to our country.

He worked at the United Fruit Company, where he met his wife of 60 years, Dorothy Treacy, "Dottie".

Jack and Dottie moved to Quincy and together raised their four children: Brian, Karen, Maureen, and Tricia in a loving and warm home. They highly valued education, making sacrifices so their children could attend Sacred Heart Elementary School, Boston College High School, and Fontbonne Academy. As Jack encouraged these opportunities for his children, he continued to pursue his own educational goals, earning his bachelor's degree from Northeastern in 1975 as he balanced full-time work and the responsibility of raising a growing young family.

Jack worked as a project manager for many years at the United Fruit Company, Talbots, and finally Blue Cross Blue Shield of Rhode Island.

A dedicated volunteer, Jack generously shared his time with Sacred Heart Church, Squantum Yacht Club, the Knights of Columbus, and most recently, the Presidents Golf Course men's league, giving back to the communities he loved.

Jack will be remembered for his storytelling, his love for Boston sports, his not always but sometimes skilled golf game, and most of all, his dedication to his community and family.

For the last 30 years, Jack's number one interest was his grandchildren. He rarely missed the opportunity to support them, attending every game, every band performance, and every dance recital he could make. His family found the perfect expression for the life he lived: he was 'Always There.'

Jack is survived by his loving wife Dottie, his four children and their families, Brian Wilk and his wife Christine of Hingham, Karen Keohane and her husband John of Quincy, Maureen Panagrossi and her husband Jon of Marshfield, and Tricia Biegel and her husband Kevin of Charleston, South Carolina.
