PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE

Engrossed Bills.

The following engrossed bills (the first of which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the Acting President (Ms. Jehlen) and laid before the Governor for her approbation, to wit:

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

The Senate Bill authorizing the town of Topsfield to convert 4 licenses for sale of wine and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises to 4 licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises and to prohibit the sale of alcoholic beverages in the containers less than 200 milliliters (Senate, No. 2526),-- came from the House passed to be engrossed, in concurrence *with an amendment*, striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in House document numbered 5650.

Moment of Silence.

Adjournment in Memory of Irene Janet Hershman.

The Senator from Plymouth and Norfolk, Mr. O'Connor, moved that when the Senate adjourns today, it does so in memory of Irene Janet Hershman, a remarkable South Shore resident, from the town of Hull, who passed away peacefully on July 25th, 2026, at the age of 96, surrounded by the family she cherished above all else.

Born to the late Jessie Zimmerman and Sybil Kreutch, Irene was a true trailblazer. In 1951, during an era when higher education opportunities for women were scarce, she worked multiple jobs to put herself through Boston University, graduating with distinction and earning the prestigious BU Cup for her extraordinary leadership. Determined to continue her education, she went on to earn a master's degree.

Irene translated that passion for learning into a distinguished career as an English teacher at Hull High School. Whether challenging advanced scholars with her deep love for drama and literature, or lifting struggling learners who needed a champion, Irene impacted generations of the South Shore's youth. Her students remembered her long after graduation for inspiring them to dream bigger and reach higher.

In addition to her career as an educator, Irene was an incredible performer, frequently taking center stage in local theater and musical productions at Temple Beth Shalom. She was an intrepid, solo traveler who explored Europe, Asia, Israel, and the UK.

Above all, Irene was devoted to her family. Introduced by her sister, the late Lila Aaron, and brother-in-law Samuel, Irene met the love of her life, Sam Hershman. They married in October 1953 and raised their family in Hull until Sam's untimely passing in 1982.

Even well into her 90s, Irene continued to power-walk five miles each day up Allerton Hill, embodying absolute grit, style, and resilience.

Irene leaves behind her three loving children: Warren, June, and Sheri; eight grandchildren: Samantha, Nicholas, Michelle, Brian, Samuel, Elliana, Casey, and Ryan; seven doting great-grandchildren: Walker, Jaxson, Landon, Lenna, Aria, Colin, and Oliver; and a community that was immeasurably enriched by her presence.

Accordingly, as a mark of respect to the memory of Irene Janet Hershman, at four minutes before one o'clock P.M., on motion of Mr. Tarr, the Senate adjourned to meet again on Monday next at eleven o'clock A.M.
