Announcement re: Attorney General Healey's "Building Toward Racial Justice and Equity in Health" Forum/Report

On November 16th, Attorney General Maura Healey convened a web-event and issued a new report: <u>Building Toward Racial Justice and Equity in Health: A Call to Action</u>. The report, <u>presentation</u>, and the <u>recording</u> are posted on the AG's website and youtube site (and were circulated to Task Force Members).

The report calls for action in five domains:

- data for identifying and addressing health disparities,
- equitable distribution of health care resources,
- telehealth as a tool for expanding equitable access to care,
- health care workforce diversity, and
- social determinants of health and root causes of health inequities.

The thoughtful panel discussion included Task Force Member Dr. Robinson. AG also established an <u>AG's Advisory Council on Racial Justice and Equity</u>, on which Dr. Minter-Jordan and Michael Curry serve.

Discussion of Updates relative to Interim Report

- Discussion of Updates relative to Interim Report approved on October 14 & the State Budget/Policy Process this Fall
- House Concluded and Senate Currently Deliberating FY21 State Budget
- Senate Budget includes Equitable Vaccine Distribution and Process, Investments in Local Boards of Health, and Cash Assistance for populations not eligible for other emergency relief, drawn from Interim Report
- Both budgets include important investments in the social factors in health (housing, food, etc.) noted in Interim Report
- Senate currently has a number of COVID-19 and Equity-related budget amendments pending
