Department of Public Utilities Energy Facilities Siting Board Trust Fund

Between October 13, 2021 and October 12, 2022, the Department of Public Utilities collected \$80,000 in revenue and expended \$0 from the Energy Facilities Siting Board Trust Fund, for an unexpended balance of \$401,169.

The outlook for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2023 for the revenue collection is estimated at \$0 for the Energy Facilities Siting Board Trust Fund. The Department expects to spend funds from the Energy Facilities Siting Board Trust fund in Fiscal Year 2024, such as for payment of any consulting and business expenses that may be incurred by the Energy Facilities Siting Board.
