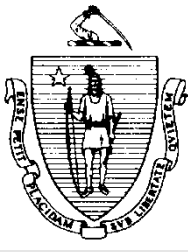

Dear Sheriff Buckley:

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) Division of Environmental Health Regulations and Standards (EHRS) conducted an inspection of the Barnstable County Correctional Facility on January 29, 2025 accompanied Captain Kenneth Shaffer, Policies Procedures and Compliance, in accordance with Department regulations 105 CMR 451.000: Minimum Health and Sanitation Standards and Inspection Procedures for Correctional Facilities.

The inspection identified 49 total deficiencies: 16 new deficiencies under the Required Standards (.100 and .200 series), 18 repeat deficiencies under the Required Standards, 4 new deficiencies under the Recommended Standards (.300 series), and 11 repeat deficiencies under the Recommended Standards.

## Overview

Please find the following letter as the response for corrective action to the January 29, 2025, inspection of the Barnstable County Correctional Facility.

Addressing the violations regarding "Cell Size: inadequate floor space" notations for Pods A, B, C, D, E, G, H, J, K, L and M, I would like to reiterate from past response letters that we are aware of the concern the Department of Health has with overcrowding situations, however, the Department of Corrections stipulates the regulations which guided the construction of our facility in 2004 and we understand there are discussion in the works for consistence between DOC and DPH regulations.

Below is a breakdown of the remaining violations and how they have been corrected:
