Re: Facility Inspection – Franklin County Jail and House of Correction, Greenfield

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) Division of Environmental Health Regulations and Standards (EHRS) conducted an inspection of the Franklin County Jail and House of Correction on May 29, 2025 accompanied by Special Operations Officers Michael Aiken Jr. and Justin Chapin in accordance with Department regulations 105 CMR 451.000: Minimum Health and Sanitation Standards and Inspection Procedures for Correctional Facilities.

The inspection identified 48 total deficiencies: 18 deficiencies under the Required Standards (.100 and .200 series), 22 repeat deficiencies under the Required Standards, 5 deficiencies under the Recommended Standards (.300 series), and 3 repeat deficiencies under the Recommended Standards.

SECTION 4: Plan of Correction

This facility does not comply with the Department's regulations cited above. In accordance with 105 CMR 451.404, please submit a plan of correction within 10 working days of receipt of this notice which includes:

- 1. Specific corrective steps to be taken
- 2. A timetable for the corrective actions for larger projects
- 3. The date by which correction will be achieved
- 4. Any interim measures being implemented to ensure the health and safety of incarcerated individuals and facility staff
- 5. The plan should be signed by the Superintendent or Administrator and submitted to my attention, at the address listed above.

SECTION 5: Observations and Recommendations

- 1. The inmate population was 125 at the time of inspection.
- 2. At the time of inspection, female inmates were being housed in B Pod.
- 3. ERHS recommends numbering all showers throughout the institution. This will assist EHRS and staff to better recognize where issues exist.
- 4. The required temperature for handwash sinks is between 110°F and 130°F.

- 3. ERHS recommends numbering all showers throughout the institution. This will assist EHRS and staff to better recognize where issues exist.
- 4. The required temperature for handwash sinks is between 110°F and 130°F.
