Re: Facility Inspection – Hampden County Jail and House of Correction, Ludlow

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) Division of Environmental Health Regulations and Standards (EHRS) conducted an inspection of the Hampden County Jail and House of Correction on May 15 and 16, 2025 accompanied by Lieutenant Michael Manning, Environmental Health and Safety Officer (EHSO), and Corporal James Nepl, in accordance with Department regulations 105 CMR 451.000: Minimum Health and Sanitation Standards and Inspection Procedures for Correctional Facilities.

The inspection identified 158 total deficiencies: 71 deficiencies under the Required Standards (.100 and .200 series), 36 repeat deficiencies under the Required Standards, 33 deficiencies under the Recommended Standards (.300 series), 16 repeat deficiencies under the Recommended Standards, and 2 deficiencies under 105 CMR 451.402(B) (other conditions that may constitute a threat to health or safety).

Overview

SECTION 4: Plan of Correction

This facility does not comply with the Department's regulations cited above. In accordance with 105 CMR 451.404, please submit a plan of correction within 10 working days of receipt of this notice which includes:

- 2. A timetable for the corrective actions for larger projects
- 3. The date by which correction will be achieved
- 4. Any interim measures being implemented to ensure the health and safety of incarcerated individuals and facility staff
- 5. The plan should be signed by the Superintendent or Administrator and submitted to my attention, at the address listed above.

SECTION 5: Observations and Recommendations

- 1. The inmate population was 802 at the time of inspection.
- 2. Housing Unit Charlie # 4 was inspected but unoccupied at the time of the inspection.
- 3. The required temperature for showers is between 100°F and 112°F.

Re: Facility Inspection - Hampden County Jail and House of Correction, Ludlow

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) Division of Environmental Health Regulations and Standards (EHRS) conducted an inspection of the Hampden County Jail and House of Correction on May 15 and 16, 2025 accompanied by Lieutenant Michael Manning, Environmental Health and Safety Officer (EHSO), and Corporal James Nebel, in accordance with Department regulations 105 CMR 451.000: Minimum Health and Sanitation Standards and Inspection Procedures for Correctional Facilities.

The inspection identified 158 total deficiencies: 71 deficiencies under the Required Standards (.100 and .200 series), 36 repeat deficiencies under the Required Standards, 33 deficiencies under the Recommended Standards (.300 series), 16 repeat deficiencies under the Recommended Standards, and 2 deficiencies under 105 CMR 451.402(B) (other conditions that may constitute a threat to health or safety).

Overview

Section 1 provides details of all deficiencies, including repeat deficiencies, found during the inspection. These are categorized by Required Standards, Recommended Standards, or additional applicable regulatory standards.

Section 2 provides information on areas that EHRS found to be compliant.

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) Division of Environmental Health Regulations and Standards (EHRS) conducted an inspection of the Hampden County Jail and House of Correction on May 15 and 16, 2025 accompanied by Lieutenant Michael Manning, Environmental Health and Safety Officer (EHSO), and Corporal James Nebel, in accordance with Department regulations 105 CMR 451.000: Minimum Health and Sanitation Standards and Inspection Procedures for Correctional Facilities.

The inspection identified 158 total deficiencies: 71 deficiencies under the Required Standards (.100 and .200 series), 36 repeat deficiencies under the Required Standards, 33 deficiencies under the Recommended Standards (.300 series), 16 repeat deficiencies under the Recommended Standards, and 2 deficiencies under 105 CMR 451.402(B) (other conditions that may constitute a threat to health or safety).
