Dear Sheriff Heroux:

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) Division of Environmental Health Regulations and Standards (EHRS) conducted an inspection of the Dartmouth Women's Center on September 9, 2025 accompanied by Michael Moreira, Fire Safety/Environmental Health and Safety Officer in accordance with Department regulations 105 CMR 451.000: Minimum Health and Sanitation Standards and Inspection Procedures for Correctional Facilities.

The inspection identified 17 total deficiencies: 4 new deficiencies under the Required Standards (.100 and .200 series), 4 repeat deficiencies under the Required Standards, 3 new deficiencies under the Recommended Standards (.300 series), 6 repeat deficiencies under the Recommended Standards.



The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) Division of Environmental Health Regulations and Standards (EHRS) conducted an inspection of the Dartmouth Women's Center on September 9, 2025 accompanied by Michael Moreira, Fire Safety/Environmental Health and Safety Officer in accordance with Department regulations 105 CMR 451.000: Minimum Health and Sanitation Standards and Inspection Procedures for Correctional Facilities.

The inspection identified 17 total deficiencies: 4 new deficiencies under the Required Standards (.100 and .200 series), 4 repeat deficiencies under the Required Standards, 3 new deficiencies under the Recommended Standards (.300 series), 6 repeat deficiencies under the Recommended Standards.
