The committee on Bills in the Third Reading, to whom was referred the

Engrossed Bill authorizing special police officers in the town of Natick to serve until the age of 70 (House, No. 3762), which was returned by His Excellency the Governor with recommendation of amendment specified by him (in a message filed as House, No. 4983),

Report recommending that the amendment recommended by His Excellency the Governor be considered in the following form:

By inserting after section 1 the following 2 sections:

“SECTION 1A. Said section 1 of said chapter 93 is hereby further amended by striking out the last sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:-
A special police officer appointed under this act shall comply with all requirements of chapter 6E of the General Laws, including: (i) maintaining certification and good standing with the Massachusetts Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission; and (ii) complying with all annual in-service and other training requirements mandated by the municipal police training committee, and shall pass a medical examination by a physician or other certified professional chosen by the town to determine that such special police officer is capable of performing the essential duties of a special police officer, the cost of which shall be borne by the special police officer, prior to performing any police details.

SECTION 1B. Section 6 of said chapter 93 is amended by striking out the last sentence.”

And that when so amended the same will be correctly
