Summary

- The Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is the most effective poverty fighter we have. It fights wage stagnation and helps hard working families make ends meet.
- Increased tax credit for eligible working families from 15% of federal EITC to 23%, putting as much as an additional \$470 into the pockets of working families.
- 3 First increase in 18 years.




